

APAC Masters Scholarship - Guidelines

APAC is dedicated to fostering academic excellence and empowering future leaders. Through scholarships, we provide meaningful financial support that allows students to focus on their studies without the weight of financial constraints. These awards not only ease the burden of student tuition fees but also inspire confidence, strengthen motivation, and enhance professional profiles, equipping graduates to make a lasting impact in their fields and communities.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for a scholarship an applicant must:

1. Be accepted into one of APAC's Master of Creative Business Management suite of degrees.
2. Maintain an overall Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 5.5 on APAC's 7-point scale each semester.

RECIPIENT PERFORMANCE AND ENROLMENT OBLIGATIONS

- The scholarship recipient is expected to excel academically, and their performance will be monitored each study period. Post award, all scholarship recipients must maintain a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 5.5 or greater in any given trimester to maintain the scholarship for the next study period. Failure to maintain this condition may result in the scholarship being terminated and the student will be required to pay full Domestic or International tuition fees.
- The scholarship does not extend to failed subjects. If a scholarship recipient fails a subject, they will be responsible for the subsequent fees for repeating that failed subject.
- All scholarship recipients must maintain full time enrolment. The scholarship will be discontinued if the recipient moves to part-time mode at any point during their studies, unless compassionate or compelling circumstances exist at the discretion of the Chief Executive Officer (CEO).
- The scholarship will be forfeited if the recipient defers or withdraws from their studies (or the entire award if the studies have not yet commenced). The scholarship will not be awarded as a fee refund and recipients will not be eligible for any financial remuneration.
- By accepting the scholarship, the recipient agrees to become a student ambassador for the duration of their studies and will be required to play an active role in APAC events such as information evenings, open days and external career exhibitions.
- The recipient must also agree to develop and provide creative content and testimonials as required. Failure to carry out the duties of the student ambassador may result in the scholarship being terminated.
- APAC also reserves the right to cease or terminate the scholarship if the recipient is found to be in breach of the Student Code of Conduct or engaged in any activity that brings APAC into disrepute. This may include, but is not limited to:
 - Academic misconduct
 - Engagement of an illegal activity
 - Publishing material that may bring APAC into disrepute.

SCHOLARSHIP VALUE AND DISBURSEMENT

- The scholarship is awarded as a 20% fee reduction at the commencement of studies and applied in each semester for a two-year duration. The value of the scholarship is subject to change dependent on the course fees for the year within which they are awarded. Course offering is subject to change.
- The scholarship amount will be deducted from tuition fees at APAC prior to payment of fees for each semester.
- Scholarships are not transferable and will not be awarded in cash (or in any other way).

REVIEWS

Candidates have the right to request a review of the decisions made by APAC in relation to a scholarship outcome. This will be managed as per APAC's [Student Complaints and Appeals Policy and Procedure](#).
