WELCOME

This International Student Information Guide will explain the excellent services and facilities that APAC provides to assist you to maximise your time with us, develop your artistic talents and make valuable contributions to the world.



STEP 1 ACCEPT YOUR OFFER

The first thing you will need to do now that you have received your unconditional course offer letter, is to formally accept it. Carefully read your offer letter that you have received via email from APAC, review the Conditions of Agreement and Student Declaration, and submit your Acceptance of Offer form . The link to accept your offer is in your Unconditional Letter of Offer. The acceptance fee deposit outlined in your course offer letter will also be payable at the time of accepting. You may choose to pay more than the prescribed amount in your course offer letter, this will be credited to your student account. APAC accepts fees via Direct Deposit. The bank details for transfer are stated in your Unconditional Letter of Offer. APAC encourages you to accept your Unconditional Letter of Offer as quickly as possible. Once you have submitted your Acceptance of Offer form, and we have received your acceptance deposit, APAC will issue you with an electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCoE) to allow you to apply for your student visa.

STEP 2 APPLY FOR YOUR VISA

APPLY FOR YOUR STUDENT VISA

You must obtain a student visa before you come to study in Australia. APAC will issue a electronic Confirmation of enrolment (eCOE) which you must use to apply for your visa.

Once received you must use your eCOE within six (6) months from it's start date to apply for your student visa before it expires.

Please make sure you allow plenty of time for your visa application to be processed by Australian immigration authorities so you arrive on time to begin classes.

You will need permission from APAC if you wish to transfer to another education provider in the first six months of your studies. You will be required to apply for a new student visa if you change to a lower education level program at any time.

VISA CONDITIONS

Student visas come with a number of conditions. It is important that you do not breach them so your visa will not be subject to cancellation.

EDUCATION SERVICES FOR OVERSEAS STUDENTS (ESOS)

The ESOS Act regulates the provision of education to overseas students in Australia. It covers the conduct of providers (universities, colleges, and schools), students and the various government departments involved. Its main purpose is to provide consumer protection for overseas students.

APAC complies with the ESOS legislation requirements.

STEP 3 GET ORGANISED CHOOSE YOUR ACCOMMODATION AND ORGANISE AIRPORT TRANSPORT

LIVING OFF CAMPUS

Purpose Built Student Accommodation

Within a short walk of the campus you will find a wide variety of high standard accommodation which is designed specifically for students. This <u>site</u> gives you some of the better known options.

Rent a House or Apartment

You may choose to rent your own accommodation. Some students choose to share a rented home with others. Quite often the experience of sharing with other students helps everyone to settle into their studies and to be successful. You can find rental houses or flats at sites including <u>realestate.com.au</u> and <u>domain.com.au</u>. There you can search for your preferred locations and style of rental accommodation. The rental obligations may vary. You can research your <u>rights and obligations here</u>.

Homestay

Some private citizens are happy to share a part of their house with an international student. The details may vary from home to home. It is important to clarify whether you will have your own bedroom, study area, wi-fi and bathroom. Some homestays provide all meals, some provide breakfast and dinner. Some provide meals during the week, but not on weekends. The following groups specialise in arranging homestay for students: <u>HomeStay network</u> and <u>Study Vision</u>.

AIRPORT TRANSPORT SERVICES

When you arrive at Brisbane International Airport you have a number of transport option including train, bus, Uber or Taxi.

One option to travel from the airport is the Airtrain. Travelling between the Brisbane Airport and Brisbane City, where APAC is located, takes just 20 minutes.

STEP 5 ENROLMENT

Once your visa has been approved, we'll need you to complete an <u>Enrolment Form</u> confirming a few details so that we can process your enrolment.

As part of your student visa conditions, you are required to let APAC know your residential address within 7 days of arriving in Australia. You can provide us with these details via the Enrolment Form or by emailing us at <u>admissions@apac.edu.au</u>.

Once enrolled, an APAC student email address will be created for you and you will have access to APACs learning resources. We will also order you a Student ID card.

As an APAC student, you may be entitled to a public transport concession. Brisbane's public transport is managed by TransLink. Once you are enrolled, check the <u>Translink website</u> to find out if you can apply for a transport concession card.




STEP 6 ATTEND ORIENTATION

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

COST OF LIVING

As a student visa holder, you will be required to have approximately AUD\$29,710* per person per year for living expenses, as advised by the Australian Government. However, the actual cost depends on your individual lifestyle so you should budget for more than this amount. Remember, your living expenses are separate from your tuition fees.

OVERSEAS STUDENT HEALTH COVER (OSHC)

Overseas Student Health Cover is compulsory for student visa holders. You will need to purchase OSHC for the proposed duration of your student visa through your preferred provider and include evidence of this payment with your tuition fees when accepting an offer of study at APAC.

FIRST DAY OF CLASSES AND LATE START

APAC classes begin on the date specified on your offer letter. If you are unable to start on the date specified in your offer letter you must apply in advance to receive written permission from APAC to begin your program late. You must email the APAC Admissions team at <u>admissions@apac.edu.au</u> and explain your reason for the request. If you have not received written approval for a late start from APAC you should not leave your home country. Please allow 48 hours from request for a response from APAC.

DEFERMENT

If you have accepted your offer and wish to defer the start of your degree to a later session, you must contact APAC to request a deferment. Deferment can only be considered if you have not already arrived in Australia or if you are studying at another institution in Australia and need more time to complete your study.

If your request to defer is successful, APAC will issue a new Letter of Offer, which you must accept. You will be issued with a new eCoE. Your student visa may be impacted.

WORKING WHILE STUDYING

Under your student visa you may work for up to 48 hours per fortnight during term. During vacation break there is no limit on how many hours you can work. This can help with your living costs as well as providing valuable experience.

Like all workers in Australia you have legal rights and protections. You can find your rights by visiting <u>Fairwork</u>. If you need help in understanding your rights, we can help.
