Description: This scholarship awards the participant with a 20% reduction of the course tuition fees for the duration of two years. This scholarship equates to a \$10,560.00 award.

Eligibility Criteria:

The Song Performance Scholarship will be awarded based upon the applicant's *demonstrated potential* across the following criteria:

- 1.) Song and/or dance performance
- 2.) Innovation
- 3.) Academic engagement
- 4.) Industry passion.

How to Apply:

All scholarship applicants must complete the following to be deemed assessable and eligible for consideration:

- A written statement (250 – 500 words) addressing your potential across the four criteria (specified above)
- A 2-minute video-recorded response to the question: “What can I bring to the Song Performance Ambassador Program?”
- A 2-minute unedited video-recorded song and/or dance performance of you performing across any contemporary genre recorded within 12 months of the submission date (*N.B: Audio content must not be digitally enhanced or “produced” in any way*).
- A video introduction of yourself outlining why you want to work in the entertainment industry.

General Terms and Conditions:

A total of two (2) scholarships are on offer each intake to be awarded across the Bachelor of Screen and Stage degree programs. Each scholarship offers a 20% reduction in tuition fees.

- The offer and amount remain the same for all APAC course offerings at our Brisbane Campus.
- The value of the Scholarships is subject to change dependent on the course fees for the year within which they are awarded.
- Scholarship award is attributable as a fee reduction for the duration of study.
- Course offering differs in each location and is subject to change.
- At the discretion of College Administration, Scholarships can and may be split and awarded as partial value or not awarded at all, depending on the overall quality of submissions.
- By accepting the Scholarship award, the recipient(s) agrees to become an Ambassador for the duration of their studies and will be required to play an active role in college events such as information evenings, open days and external career exhibitions.
- The recipient(s) must also agree to take part in marketing activities, develop and provide creative content and testimonials as required. Failure to carry out the duties of the Ambassador may result in the Scholarship award being terminated.
- All recipients are required to attend key recruitment events in Brisbane. Failure to attend may result in the Scholarship award being terminated.
- The final award is subject to the winner(s) satisfying the age, eligibility, and education requirements of Australian Performing Arts Conservatory entry criteria.

- Only domestic students (including New Zealand citizens) are eligible to apply.
- Scholarship award is only available to new students who have not been previously enrolled in the same level course at Australian Performing Arts Conservatory.
- Scholarship award only applies to full-time, on-campus study.
- Should a Scholarship student intend to transition to part-time mode at any point during their studies, the College reserves the right to discontinue the award.
- Deferral or withdrawal of studies will result in forfeit of the remainder of the Scholarship award (or the entire award if the studies have not yet commenced).
- The Scholarship recipient is expected to excel academically, and their performance will be monitored each study period. A failure to meet academic obligations may result in forfeit of the Scholarship award. Subsequent fees for repeating a failed subject will be the responsibility of the student.
